Shandon Summer Street Party

Local Area Plan

The Local Area Plan was adopted by Dublin City Council on October 6. According to the Council's website, the adopted Local Area Plan document is currently being prepared and will be available shortly. The proposals for apartments on CIE's disused land behind the park and for "mews houses" along Shandon's boundary with it have been completely dropped. The plan now is to extend Mount Bernard Park into the disused CIE land.

Parking on Shandon Drive

Residents have expressed concern about ongoing parking problems on Shandon Drive. The Residents Association will organize a public meeting on this issue in the Pitch and Putt club in the coming weeks and residents will be notified in due course.

Luas line
