Celebrating its 110th birthday, Shandon Road hosted this year's festivities. The Photo Booth proved to be a big hit as did the simpler attractions of skipping ropes and chalk.

On a fine evening a large turnout enjoyed themselves until late, entertained by local musical talent. Big thanks are due to the Shandon Road organising group and to Phizzfest who generously helped out.



Spring Clean-Up in April

As usual Shandon took part in the National Spring Clean-Up supported by An Taisce and by Dublin City Council (DCC). After their morning's work those who took part enjoyed coffee and a chat in Bang Bang.



Mount Bernard Park Extension

Mount Bernard Park has been extended by incorporating disused land adjoining the park that previously belonged to various state agencies. Over the summer, DCC constructed a tarmac path loop in the added area.



With this development has unfortunately come an increased level of anti-social behaviour, including arson. SRA is engaging with the Gardai, DCC Parks Dept. and elected representatives to get an effective response to this problem.

Play Streets



Under DCC auspices, Shandon Drive and Shandon Gardens were two of the locations for well-attended Play Streets events in September. Play Streets aims to promote safe outdoor play opportunities for children in their home area. Having Play Streets as a regular feature rather than just a once-off occurrence is an item SRA has been asked to include on its AGM agenda.

Road Reinstatement by KLM

KLM, the contractors that dug up Shandon Crescent and part of Shandon Park earlier this year, inform us that they will return to carry out road reinstatement work from October 15th. DCC has given consent for KLM to paint double yellow lines in the laneway leading into the Pitch and Putt clubhouse and also in the laneway connecting Shandon park to Shandon Gardens (between Nos. 72-74 Shandon Park)

Greenway Updates: Phases 3 and 4

The final stretch of Phase 3 of the Royal Canal Greenway, the 2.1km North Strand to Crossguns Bridge section was officially opened on 5 September. Some ramp sections had to be revised near the Croke Park segment which appeared to add some time and complexity to the process.



The Phase 4 section is from Crossguns to Ashtown. The current plans include a controversial narrowing of the channel of the Royal Canal in order to widen the towpath. In May 2024, An Coimisiún Pleanála required DCC to provide more detailed reports, including hydrological assessments showing how historic contaminants currently under the silt, such as creosote, would be safely removed. The project is on hold waiting for this work to be completed.

Phibsboro Shopping Centre



(Most of) the Phibsboro Shopping Centre has a new owner, Twinlite.

Previously granted planning permissions for this site have now expired, so any redevelopment the company proposes to undertake will require a new planning application.
